## <u>Taiwan's Cross-Border Carbon Adjustment Mechanism Draft Law: A Step Toward</u> **Global Harmonization**

Synopsis: Taiwan is set to introduce its own Cross-Border Carbon Adjustment Mechanism by the second half of 2025. The country aims to align this mechanism with global trade rules, specifically those of the World Trade Organization. The move comes in response to complaints from local steel and cement producers who are facing unfair competition due to the lack of carbon emission disclosures from foreign suppliers. This policy will require importers to disclose their carbon emissions and will impose a carbon levy on domestic producers starting in 2025. Taiwan's approach will be influenced by European Union regulations to ensure fair practices in the international trade of carbon-intensive goods.
